## Syrians in Jordan: Refugee Qualification Recognition Scheme launched by UK NARIC

A new support scheme in Jordan for Syrian refugees has been launched by UK NARIC. The 'Syrians in Jordan: Refugee Qualification Recognition Scheme' is funded by BEIS, the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy.

Over 600,000 Syrian refugees are currently in camps on the Jordan side of the border, and over 2 million in Jordan as a whole. The new scheme will assist economic inclusion and refugees' placement into further study in Jordan, and give guidance on the progression or completion of studies.

The scheme provides UK NARIC comparabilities of qualifications tailored to Jordan standards, for use by employers or educational institutions in Jordan. Part-completed studies will be allocated credits to align with Jordan credit systems. Applicants receive next steps guidance. All statements, explanatory notes and advice are in English and Arabic.

Following the successful one-year pilot of the [European Qualifications Passport for Refugees](#), a new phase (2018-2020) of this trans-European project is being commenced by the Council of Europe.

UK NARIC CEO Dr Cloud Bai-Yun attended the official launch of this new phase in Athens on 28 March.

The qualification passport concept was co-devised by UK NARIC and NOKUT, the Norwegian NARIC. UK NARIC has taken part in the pilot in Greece during 2017, in which refugees were interviewed by panels of credential evaluators, permitting qualifications and skills to be assessed even in cases of partial or missing documentation.

Now, additional country partners are set to take part in this new phase. New refugee groups will be assessed and there will be increased use of online interviews. ([more...](#))

### Kazakh NIS Grade 12 Cert comparable to A Level

UK NARIC's International Projects Group has completed its benchmarking study of Kazakhstan's Nazarbayev Intellectual Schools' (NIS) Grade 12 Certificate, and has evaluated it as comparable to the overall GCE A Level standard.

The NIS was established by Kazakh President Nursultan Nazarbayev to create and pilot a new educational programme for high schools and now has a network of 20 purpose-built schools, 19 of which are offering the 'NIS-Program'.
