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# An update on education in Gaza and Lebanon



The conflict in Gaza and Lebanon has caused significant disruption to education across the region.

UK ENIC experts working in our Information Development team have been monitoring changes and developments across the region.

In Gaza, schools have been closed since October 2023. All universities in Gaza were reported to have been destroyed by January this year (Scholars At Risk – Jan 2024).

Schooling across Lebanon, particularly in Beirut and the south of the country, has been suspended



Members have highlighted the 'invaluable information' available through UK ENIC membership.

The positive feedback was received as part of the annual member survey, which ran for 7 weeks over the summer

More than three quarters of survey respondents said they are education providers and responses showed an overall Net Promoter Score (NPS) for UK ENIC services of 51, UK ENIC online databases received 55 and the Member Enquiry Service scored 57. Scores over 50+ are regarded as 'excellent'.

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# UK ENIC at ARAQUA project conference

The Automatic Recognition of HE Access Qualifications (ARAQUA) project was funded by the European Union, with the aim of facilitating greater higher education mobility amongst participating countries and beyond.

The project involved ENIC-NARIC centres from Denmark, Estonia, Italy, Malta, Romania, Slovakia and the UK.

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# 41 qualifications reviewed, resulting in 16 database updates

As part of our ongoing database development work, during the last couple of months UK ENIC has reviewed another 41 qualifications from: Afghanistan, Burundi, Eritrea, France, Germany, Ghana, Hong Kong, Hungary, Iran, Ireland, Jamaica, Japan,

(Lebanese National News Agency – Sept 2024). The Ministry of Education and Higher Education has closed universities across the country, with exceptions for some faculties (University World News – Oct 2024).
